Phil Winters - Technical Director

Phil Winters is a musician, nature photographer, and theatre professional in St. John's. Experienced in all aspects of stage craft, he is mainly a lighting designer. He has designed lighting for plays, musicals, and

contemporary dance. As a guitarist, he has performed with prominent influential bands Schizoid and BUNG, Liz Band, Fur Packed Action, and Hot Nuts. Current projects are Psychobilly Cadillacs and Jigger. Some of Phil's photos have recently been published in *Stouts, Millers and Forky-Tails: Insects of Newfoundland*. This is his first show with PerSIStence and he hopes it will not be the last!



MARGARET IRIS DULEY (1894-1968): Literary and Personal Trailblazer and Seeker

Margaret Duley was Newfoundland and Labrador's first novelist of significance. She published internationally to critical acclaim in the late 1930's and early 1940s. She was the first to use a Newfoundland setting - its people, seascapes, landscapes, folklore and culture - as an integral part of wider themes.



Her four novels, namely, *Eyes of the Gull, Cold Pastoral, Highway to Valour*, and *Novelty on Earth* were published in London, New York, Toronto and Sweden. Today only *Cold Pastoral* (Breakwater Press, 2014) remains in print. Comments from critics such as prose "of exceptional human and artistic beauty" (*New York Times*, 1941) and a story "managed with artistry" (*London Times Literary Supplement*, 1936) were common. Yet Duley received limited attention in the land she loved, partly due to the circumstances of the Depression but also because she challenged many orthodoxies.

The searing losses of World War One led her to question the Christian and imperial certainties of her childhood. She was a spiritual seeker and studied other religions. She was a suffragist and feminist who challenged the sexual double standard and included issues of divorce, abortion and "mansplaining" in her plots. She confronted in life and literature the life choices available to a postwar generation of single women whose male contemporaries lay under the soil of the Somme. All of her novels feature a woman who feels "out of place" for different reasons in both outport and city.

Brilliant, formidably well-read, articulate, witty and dramatic she was as vivid in real-life as her writing. Her voice was finally silenced by Parkinson's dementia. But not quite. Her writing still speaks to another generation.



Donna Butt - Tryphena Duley

Donna is the artistic and executive director of Rising Tide Theatre. She has contributed to the province's artistic life as an actor, writer, director, dramaturge and producer for 45 years. Donna is a recipient of the

Order of Canada and the Order of Newfoundland and Labrador. She lives and works in Trinity where Rising Tide presents Seasons in the Bight, a festival of work that reflects the history, culture and character of our province and features some of our finest artists. In winter Donna travels the highways with the annual Revue. She is honoured to be part of the economic and cultural life of this province, and of its vibrant and dedicated artistic community.



Torquil Colbo - Nelson Duley

Torquil Colbo hails from St. John's and has been living in Toronto since before the turn of the millennium where he gets mistaken for Torquil Campbell on a monthly basis. Theatre highlights: Cripple Billy,

Highlights include working with Teatro Es Artes in El Salvador and their participation in The World Festival of Children's Theatre; and with Shakespeare Link Canada: multi-disciplined adaptations of *A Midsummer Night's Dream* in Mozambique, and *Montes Numuli* and *Romeo and Juliet*, a hearing/ deaf multilingual experiment. Edward has taught with the University of Guelph ,the University of Michigan, the National Theatre School of Canada, Humber College, George Brown College, The Centre for Indigenous Theatre, and the National Ballet School of Canada. Fraud of Newfoundland, PerSIStence Theatre Company, Opera on the Avalon, Perchance Theatre, Resource Centre for the Arts Theatre, White Rooster Theatre, Wonderbolt Circus, Theatre St. John's, and many others.



Kelly Bruton - Costume Design

Since arriving in Newfoundland via Botswana, 25 years ago, Kelly has contributed to the cultural landscape of the province as an artist, educator, filmmaker, activist, mentor, designer and

collaborator. She studied at the Nova Scotia College of Art and Design in Halifax, Nova Scotia her birthplace where she graduated with degrees in Fine Art (textiles and sculpture) and Art Education (1991). Travel has enriched her artistic practice over the past 25+ years. She has trekked into mountain ranges Rockies (Canada), Simien (Ethiopia), Himalayas, (India and Nepal), has reached the summit of Mt. Kilimanjaro, (Kenya) traveled by water into the Okavango Delta (Botswana), Lake Malawi (Malawi) and Lake Tana (Ethiopia). These incredible encounters with the nature also include intense cultural exchanges with people. Seeking out traditional makers in their local communities continuing ancient and modern textile practices. These intense experiences continue to broaden her cultural and artistic palettes. Kelly's contribution as an Artist for social change in her local community and abroad, includes a decade of service on the Board of Directors for Oxfam Canada resulted in her appointment as Board Chair and as a Board Trustee for Oxfam International. This voluntary work in International Development was inspired by living and working in Botswana in southern Africa. She is currently a Board Director for the Social Justice Cooperative NL, SKS Children's Centre and an Artist volunteer at the Gathering Place.



Marie Jones - Lila / Mme. Dupont

Marie is an AB-born performer, writer and director based in St. John's. Some of her recent appearances include Other Women Walk (White Rooster Theatre); Isle of Demons, Women Playing Hamlet (PerSIStence);

West Moon, Trinity Newfoundlande Pageant, No Man's Land (Rising Tide); Twelve Nasty Women, Room for a Pony, Curved (Women's Work Festival); Cookstown (Salt Teeth Theatre); Proud, Village Wooing (Double Sure Theatre Co-op); Leave of Absence (New Curtain); and Under Wraps (Artistic Fraud). Marie holds a BA (Hons.) in Drama from the U of A and is a grad of George Brown Theatre School. Her Closely, her first full-length writing devised from letters and diaries of Franz Kafka, will reach the LSPU Hall mainstage in 2020.



Ruth Lawrence - Margaret Duley

Ruth Lawrence works as a theatre and film maker. In 2020, she makes her directorial feature debut with *Little Orphans* (Imagine That Productions). Her first feature documentary, *Circus by Komatik* (Firecrown

Productions) was broadcast on CBC in July and can be seen on GEM.

She directed The Ennis Sisters' music video *Shine Your Light* (Blue Pinion Films) to mark the 100th Anniversary of the CMHA. She is the artistic director of White Rooster Theatre. Ruth has received a Best Actress Award at the Atlantic Film Festival, the RBC Michelle Jackson Award for Emerging Filmmaker, ArtsNL's Artist of the Year, the Queen's Jubilee Medal, the YWCA Woman of Distinction and WIFT Atlantic's WAVE Award.



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Berni Stapleton - Playwright

Berni Stapleton is a Newfoundland- Labrador writer and performer of unique distinction. Her play *The Pope and Princess Di* is listed on the Playwrights Guild of Canada's "The SureFire List" of top 23 plays from

female playwrights in Canada, and her play Woman in a Monkey Cage was also long-listed. Berni has been a playwright-in-residence with companies across Canada, and her plays are regularly produced nationally and internationally, including Offensive To Some, Brazil Square, Our Frances, and the script for the currently touring production of No Change in the Weather - a Newfoundland Musical. Other accolades include The Rhonda Payne award from Arts NL; the Writer's Association of NL award for best work in non-fiction for her contribution to the book They Let Down Baskets; and the Ambassador of Tourism award from Hospitality NL. Berni received the 2018 Arts and Letters award for best dramatic script, and was supported by the Canada Council to write her book Girly Muckle and the Queer Hands. Her new one woman show is called Late Lesbians and Other Bloomers, and Berni is one of the featured performers in Artistic Fraud's Between Breaths. Berni was the Artistic Director of the Grand Bank Regional Theatre Festival for 11 years, was dramaturge for and helped devise transVersing (Artistic Fraud/Love of Learning), and most recently directed Sharon King-Campbell's play Original for PerSIStence Theatre.
